END OF TERM POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR REWARD – CARNIVAL

At the end of Term 3 we will be celebrating the excellent behaviour of our students by hosting a Carnival. We have been holding this reward in Term 3 for the last three years and the student feedback has always been extremely positive. All year we have had students asking us, "When is the Carnival Reward?"

For our Carnival Reward, students choose to participate in a variety of fun carnival themed games and activities in order to win prizes. They move around freely with their friends, listen to music, participate in games and have a great time! Only students that



demonstrate excellent behaviour throughout the term will be invited to attend the reward. This means <u>no more than one</u> - Time-away Class, TAP Room or Office Referral in Term 3. At IWSS we understand that mistakes can occur from time to time. For this reason we offer up to three perseverance cards each term. Perseverance cards are awarded to students who have received more than one of the consequences mentioned above, but have worked hard to improve their behaviour throughout the term in order to earn an invitation to the reward. Students are nominated for a perseverance card by their classroom teacher and therefore must consistently demonstrate appropriate behaviour inside and outside of the classroom to be considered.

ADJUSTMENT TO ELIGIBILITY TO ATTEND END OF TERM REWARD

Ipswich West is a school that strives to improve and support all students. In Term 3, the PBL Team is trialling a new system that allows students to attend the end of term reward if they have less than 2 behaviour incidents throughout the term. Prior to this, a student was not eligible to attend if they received a Time-away class, a TAP room or an Office Referral. The decision to trial this change has been brought about as part of our continued efforts to cater for all students. We understand that some students need additional support and we work consistently with them to support their choices.

The PBL Team understands that everyone makes mistakes and the important thing is that we grow and learn from them. At the end of the term the PBL Team will meet and analyse the impact that this change has had on the number of students attending our end of term reward. We are a Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) school so it is important that we focus on the 'Positive' whenever possible.

CAMP

I wanted to say a massive thank you to **Miss Tether, Mr Larsen** and **Miss Gage** for making our Year 5/6 camp possible. These teachers gave up their time to watch, care for and support our Year 5 and 6 students while on camp in Week 1. The students had a fantastic time participating in a range of activities including aquatics, low and high ropes, orienteering, and camp-out. The top three highlights that students have shared with me were aquatics, the giant swing and the food! Students focused on improving their teamwork and resilience throughout their time at camp. This semester in Japanese;

Prep, Year 1 and Year 2

- Participate in a unit called "Who's in my family?"

- Students will participate in intercultural experiences to notice similarities and differences in the concept of family, group belonging and respect.

Assessment

This will include a speaking test where students will be asked to respond to questions with single words and set phrases to present information about their family.

Year 3 and Year 4

- Participating in a unit called "Out and About".
- Discuss the different items you can buy at a Japanese convenience store, explore the language used when shopping in Japan and compare different customer service practices in Australia and Japan.



Assessment

Will include a listening test where students will listen to a shopping conversation and answer questions.

Year 5 and Year 6

- Participate in a unit called "How Do We Play?"
- Discuss traditional Japanese games and toys and play a simple game while speaking in Japanese.



<u>Assessment</u>

Include a speaking test where students will be asked to play a board game with a partner and use simple Japanese phrases while they play.


